Caio Smith-Evans was the first patient through the doors to use the new plaster room and was treated by Steven Williams & Stephen Gallacher.

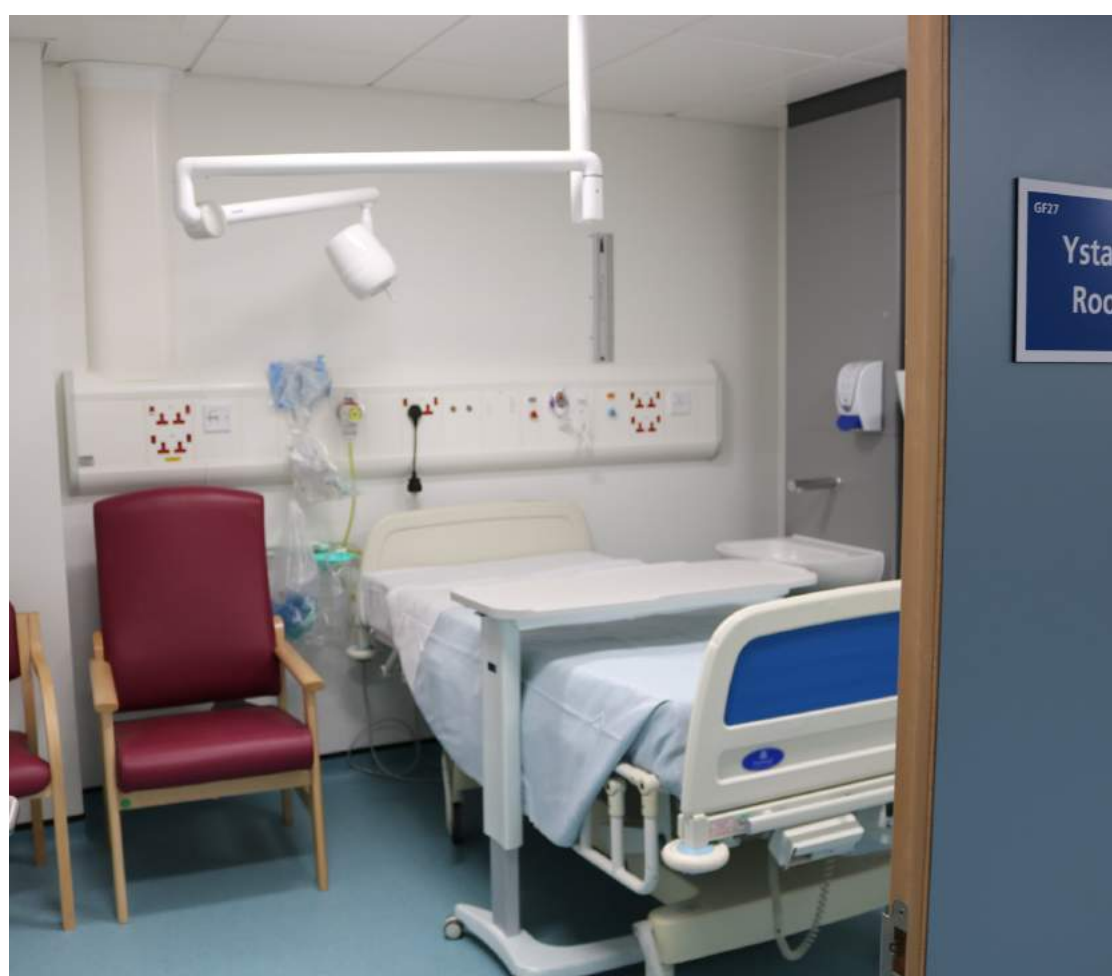
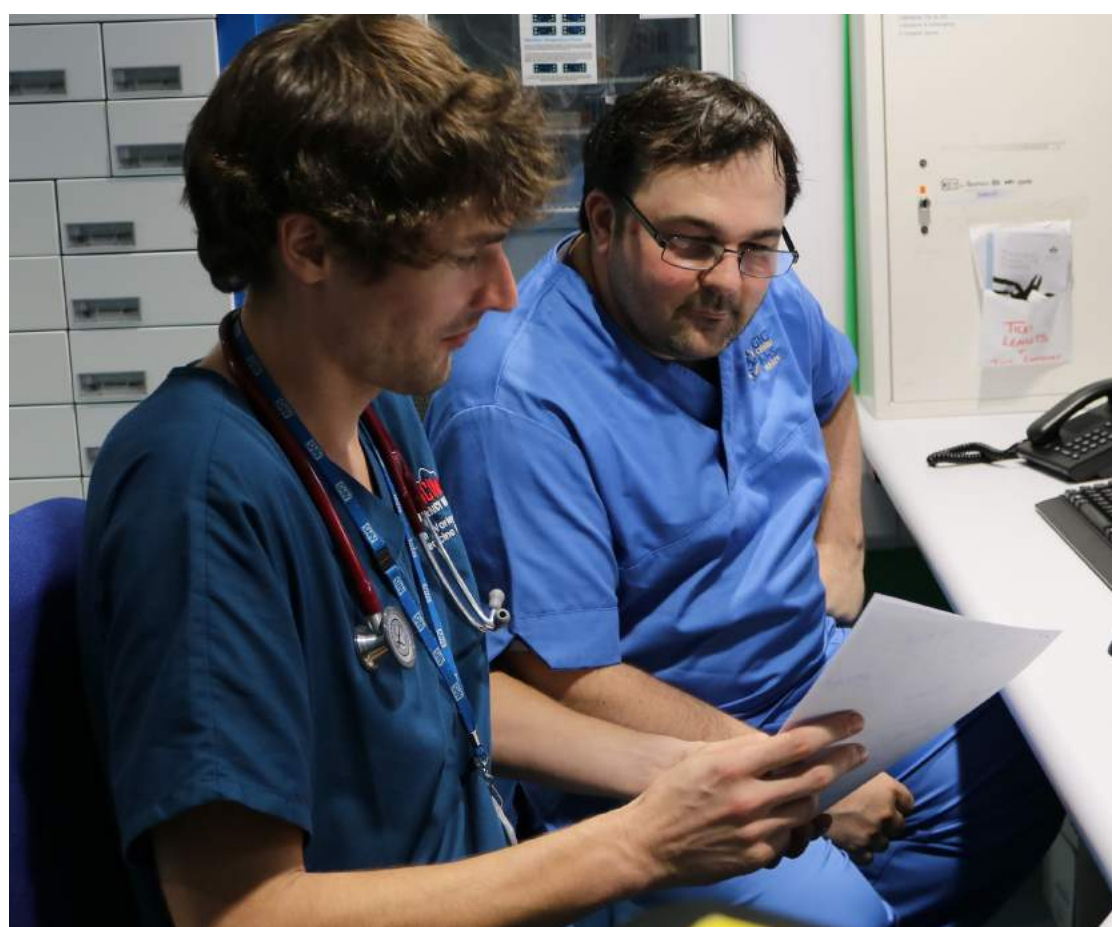
Emergency Department Assistant, Steven Williams, said the new room will enable them to provide a better service for patients.

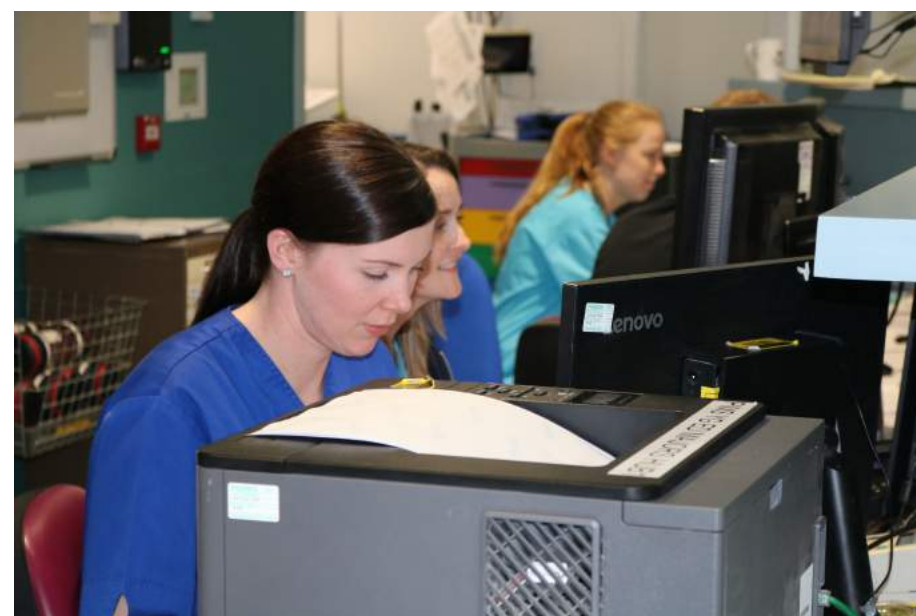
